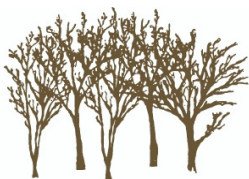

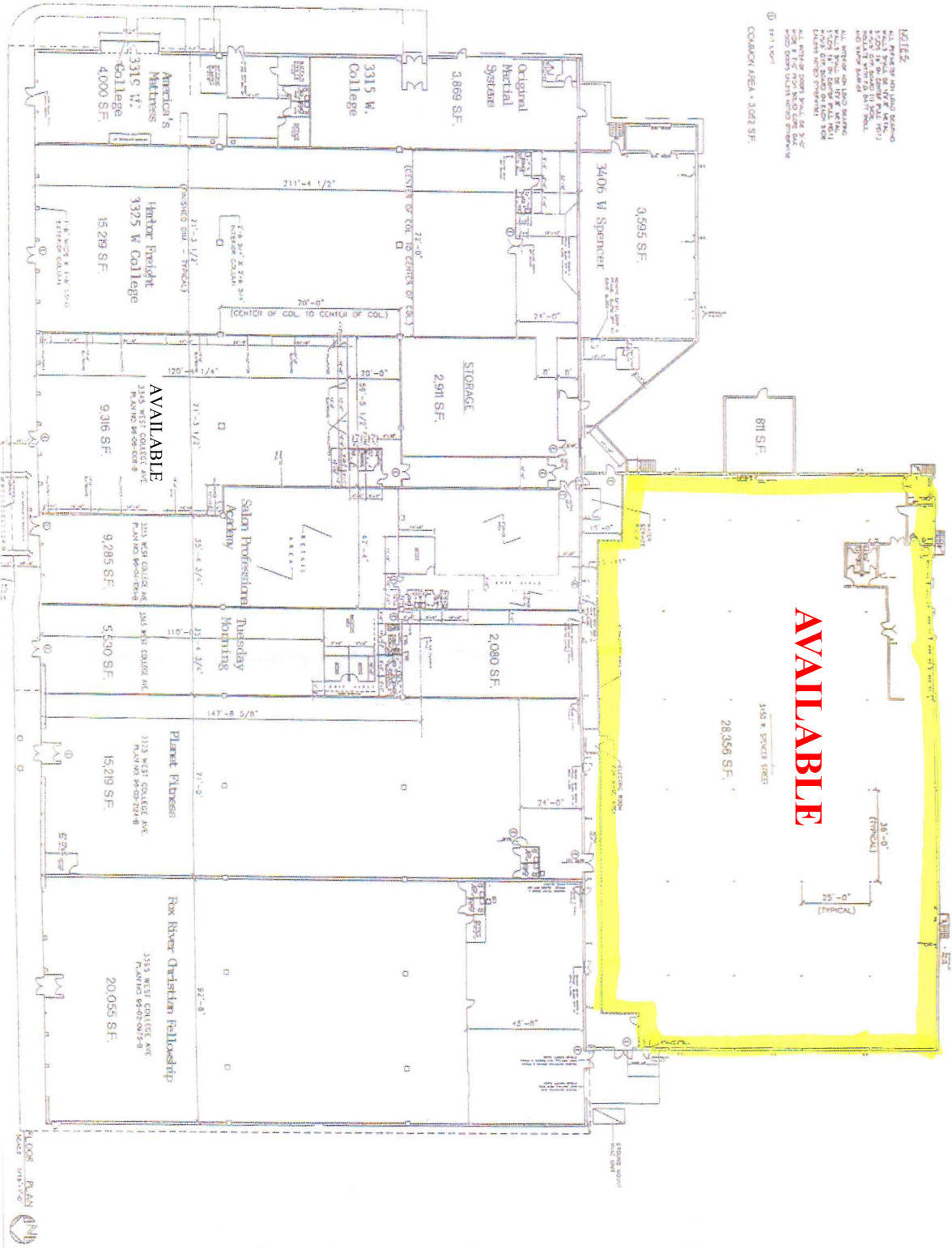

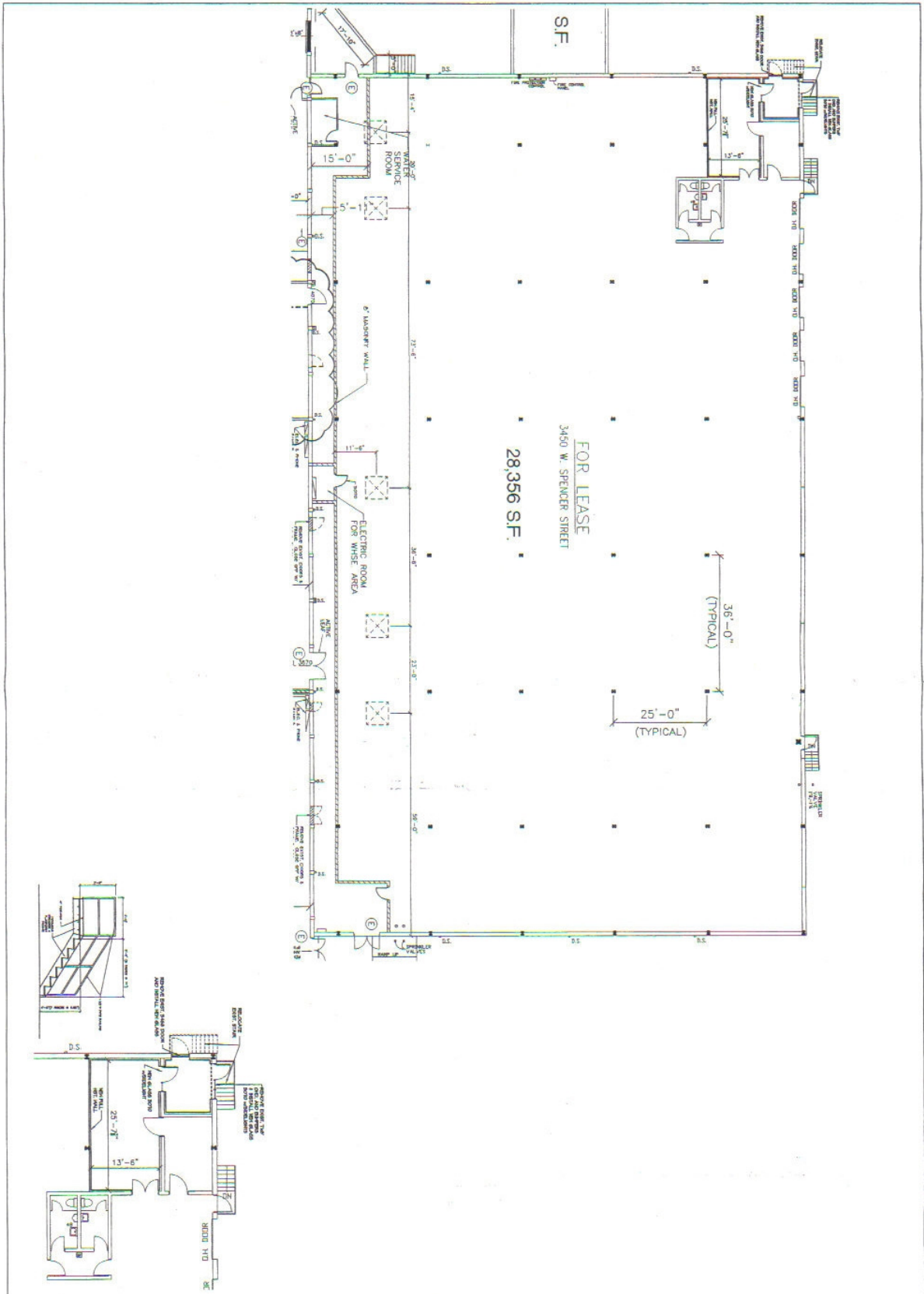

- 13 ■ The duty to protect your confidentiality. Unless the law requires it, the broker will not disclose your confidential information or the
14 confidential information of other parties (See Lines 22-39).
- 15 ■ The duty to safeguard trust funds and other property the broker holds.
- 16 ■ The duty, when negotiating, to present contract proposals in an objective and unbiased manner and disclose the advantages and
17 disadvantages of the proposals.
