### THE BUILDING | HISTORY

Constructed in the late 1800's on Peters Street, named for Richard Peters who built Atlanta's first street railway and is considered a founder of Atlanta. The structure originally housed retail shops and a livery office (horse and mule sales). It was listed as Harper Brothers Stables in 1900 and as L.H. Fair and Co. stables in 1910. A full-service livery operation was maintained in the rear portion until the 1930's with a wide range of neighborhood businesses following.

In 1996, the forgotten old barn now called Stable 1897 was purchased by internationally shown artists Carolyn Carr and Michael Gibson from brothers Wynn and Ty Pennington. It stands in what is now known as the Castleberry Hill neighborhood, originally dubbed Snake Nation. "The name Snake Nation is of unknown derivation that was used by the public press during the late-1840s and early 1850s to identify a settlement along Peters Street from the railroad crossing South Fair Street (that was) devoted almost entirely to the criminal and immoral element." Franklin Garrett confirms in his Atlanta and Environs. "Snake Nation was the tenderloin district of the young town for many years." He also commented that law and order were perilously close to extinction by 1851. The Atlanta City Council was in deep distress about the faro dens, cockfighting, drinking, prostitution, thievery, and murderous environments. When the 'Orderly' party won the election for mayor, a large body of disguised Atlantans raided Snake Nation and tried to burn it down." Luckily, the Stable 1897 building escaped the fire.

Over the years since Carr and Gibson purchased the Stable, Castleberry Hill has grown more and more popular. Further, they have rented studios within the building to fellow creative Atlantans: Angus Brown (Chef), William Downs (Art Studio), Herman Howard (Studio H Architecture Planning Environments (SHAPE), Marcia Wood (Residence), Fay Gold (Exhibition Space), Paul Pendergrass (Writing Studio), Daniel Soder (photographer, designer, and sculptor), JD Walsh (Contemporary Artist)--to name just a few who have contributed to the buildings ongoing history.






